Example Questions for the Panel:

- 1. What sorts of written agreements are needed if the Tribes and agencies like the Fish and Wildlife Service and the National Park Service move forward with buffalo restoration at Charles M. Russel Refuge, Glacier National Park or other public lands?
- 2. What are the potential sources for buffalo is buffalo are reintroduced at CMR or GNP?
- 3. Are there disease or genetic issues associated with any of these herds?
- 4. As a starting point, a plan has been proposed to start with an initial reintroduction of 100 buffalo at the UL Bend in the middle of CMR and grow this herd to 1000 animals. Is this a good starting point? Are there other options?
- 5. If the Tribes and federal land management agencies agree to establish a herd, will an environmental impact statement be needed.
- 6. If a number of Tribes agree to co-manage a herd at CMR, which sort of inter-tribal agreement is needed? What are the options for choosing a herd manager including consultation with Tribal Councils, elders, etc.
- 7. If a Tribes agree to co-manage a herd at CMR, how would hunting be managed? How could permits be allocated between Tribes and with non-tribal members.
